



Is one of the foremost experts on regional and local level indicators in Europe and has extensive experience of issues pertaining to regional development and spatial planning in Europe, the Baltic Sea Region and the Nordic Countries.

He has co-ordinated and/or participated in a large number of international policy-oriented projects on a pan-European level.

He has good knowledge of relevant institutions within the field and a well-established personal network of policy makers and researchers.

His clients include supranational development organisations (such as the European Commission: Eurostat, DG Regio, Committee of the Regions; the OECD; as well as the Nordic Council of Ministers), national ministries responsible for regional development and spatial planning in several European countries, numerous cross-border cooperation bodies, and a vast number of regional and local level development organisations.

He is currently involved in developing a set of well-being indicators for the EU Commission.

Is a graduate and holds a doctorate of Vienna University of Technology and an honorary doctorate of Blekinge Institute of Technology at Karlskrona, Sweden.

He is a professor of spatial policy systems in Europe at Delft University of Technology, Honorary Member of the Royal Town Planning Institute (1993) and of the Association of European Schools of Planning (2008).

Books on planning theory and Dutch and European planning, the latest ones on 'The Making of the European Spatial Development Perspective: No Masterplan' (2002; with B. Waterhout), and multi-authored volumes on 'European Spatial Planning' (2002); 'Territorial Cohesion and the European Model of Society' (2007) and 'European Spatial Research and Policy (2008).

A summary of his work has come out with Routledge under 'Cohesion, Coherence, Cooperation: European Spatial Planning in the Making?' (2010).
